1987 EAGLES GAME-BY-GAME REVIEW

(Figures are actual attendance)

Game 1, Sept. 13 Washington 34, Eagles 24 RFK Stadium 52,128

Philadelphia twice came from behind to tie the game but in the end, fell to the eventual Super Bowl champions, 34-24. The defeat marked the fourth straight opening day loss for the Eagles. The Redskins marched to a 10-0 lead in the 1st quarter after a Jess Atkinson FG and a 60-yard TD pass from Doug Williams to WR Art Monk. Early turnovers hampered the Birds, but a 30-yard TD pass from Randall Cunningham to Mike Quick and a Paul McFadden FG tied the game at 10-10. After two rushing TDs staked the Skins to a 24-10 lead, the Birds mounted another comeback effort. A 3-yard TD run by Cunningham set the stage for a stellar play by DE Reggie White, who stole the ball from Williams and ran 70 yards for a game-tying TD late in the 3rd quarter. It was the first TD scored by the Birds' defense since Buddy Ryan became head coach in 1986. But, after a 54-yard kickoff return, Williams' 39-yard TD pass to Monk put Washington ahead for good.

Game 2, Sept. 20 Eagles 27, New Orleans 17 Veterans Stadium 57,485

The Eagles forced five turnovers and overcame a 10-0 deficit en route to a 27-17 victory over the Saints. The turnovers consisted of three interceptions (two by Elbert Fowles), and two fumble recoveries. A Paul McFadden FG and TD passes from QB Randall Cunningham to WRs Mike Quick and Kenny Jackson gave the Birds a 17-10 halftime lead. In the second half, the Eagles recovered a fumbled punt on the Saints' 23-yard line to set up Paul McFadden's second FG of the game. Two series later, Birds' DE Clyde Simmons sacked Saints' QB Bobby Hebert and forced a fumble that LB Seth Joyner carried 18 yards for his first NFL TD. The Birds' defense held New Orleans' rushing game to just 32 yards, the fewest rushing yards allowed since a victory over the Saints on October 16, 1969. In particular, Philadelphia limited Saints' RB Reuben Mayes to just 20 yards on 13 carries.

Chicago 35, Eagles 3

Veterans Stadium 4,074

In the first of three replacement games during the NFL players' strike, the Eagles fell to the Bears 35-3. Chicago opened the scoring with a 9-yard pass from QB Mike Hohensee to FB Lakel Heimull on the Bears' second possession of the 1st quarter. The TD was set up when the Bears defense registered the first of its 11 QB sacks on the day (tying an Eagles' team record for most sacks allowed) and recovered the ensuing fumble at the Eagles' 34-yard line. From that point on it was all down hill for the Birds as Chicago dominated on both sides of the ball and scored 28 unanswered points in the 2nd quarter. Chicago QB Mike Hohensee completed 12 of 22 passes for 157 yards in just over two quarters of work, including TD passes to three different receivers in the first half. Dave Jacobs' 27-yard FG provided the Eagles' only points on the day.

In the second week of replacement games during the NFL players' strike, the Eagles faced a Cowboys' club bolstered by seven members of their regular roster, including three all-pros. Dallas dominated early, scoring three TDs on their first five offensive plays. On the Cowboys' first play from scrimmage, Kelvin Edwards raced 62 yards for a TD on a reverse. Dallas then blocked an Eagles' punt and Alvin Blount ran 8 yards for a TD. On Dallas' first play of their next possession, Kelvin Sweeney completed a 77-yard TD pass to Cornell Burbage. The Eagles eventually got in gear, setting season highs for total yards (434) and net passing yards (362), but it was not enough. Scott Tinsley became the first Eagles' QB since 1985 to throw for 300 yards in a game. Midway through the 2nd quarter, the Birds cut the deficit to 21-10 after a FG and a 62-yard pass from Tinsley to Kevin Bowan. After two FGs increased Dallas' lead to 27-10, RB Tony Dorsett opened the 2nd half with a 10-yard TD run. The Birds then fumbled and Blount ran for another TD. Tinsley closed out the scoring with TD passes of 13-yards each to Mike Siano and Topper Clemons.

In the third and final replacement game, Philadelphia dropped a 16-10 decision to the Packers in overtime. The Eagles' offense moved the ball effectively in the first half, both on the ground and through the air, netting 218 yards. FB Alvin Ross capped an 85-yard drive with a 5-yard TD run to put the Birds up 7-0 in the 1st quarter. A 42-yard FG by Packer Max Zendejas in the 2nd quarter narrowed the Eagles' lead to 7-3 at the half. Green Bay then took the lead in the 3rd quarter on a 46-yard TD pass from QB Alan Risher to WR Lee Morris. With just under four minutes left to play, Philadelphia kicker Dave Jacobs tied the score at 10-10 on a 45-yard FG and sent the game into OT. The Packers won the OT coin flip and drove 76-yards in 10 plays to win the game on a 7-yard TD run by FB James Hargrove.

In the first post-strike game, the Eagles' regulars defeated the Cowboys 37-20. A strong effort by the Birds' defense included 5 forced fumbles (recovered 3), a blocked field goal, and 5 sacks. In the 2nd quarter, the Eagles' forced Dallas to turn the ball over via the fumble on the Cowboys' first two possessions and then blocked a FG attempt. Philadelphia's offense capitalized, turning the second fumble recovery into a 45-yard FG by Paul McFadden and returning the blocked kick deep into Dallas territory to set up the first of two TD passes from QB Randall Cunningham to TE John Spagnola. In the first half, Dallas gained 174 yards through the air, but was grounded in the second half when the Eagles forced QB Danny White to intentionally ground the ball once and sacked him three times, including twice by DE Clyde Simmons. Simmons also recovered a fumble and was responsible for the blocked FG attempt. For his efforts, Simmons earned NFC defensive player of the week honors. RB Keith Byars contributed 94 rushing yards (1 TD) to the win.

The Eagles mounted a successful two-minute drill to come from behind and defeat the Cardinals 28-23. St. Louis jumped to a 6-0 1st quarter lead as FB Earl Ferrell ran 8 yards for a TD, but the PAT was blocked by Eagles' DE Clyde Simmons. Early in the 2nd quarter, Eagles' WR Cris Carter made his first pro reception, a 22-yard TD pass from QB Randall Cunningham. The Eagles then opened a 15-point lead in the 3rd quarter when RB Keith Byars swept two yards into the end zone and Cunningham heaved a 70-yard bomb to WR Kenny Jackson. But the Cardinals surprised the Birds with 17 unanswered points, including an 8-yard TD pass to TE Robert Awalt, that put St. L. ahead 23-21. With 1:50 left to play, Cunningham marched the Eagles 70 yards to the winning TD, a 9-yard pass to WR Greg Garrity (who, in 1986, was stopped at the Cards' 2 on the game's final play in a loss at St. L.). For his role in the comeback and a 291-yard, 3TD passing effort, Cunningham earned NFC offensive player of the week honors.

For the second consecutive week, QB Randall Cunningham worked magic with WR Greg Garrity as they combined for another game-winning TD in the final minutes of play. As they did a week earlier, the Birds surrendered a lead late in the 4th quarter to necessitate the Cunningham-Garrity heroics. The victory also marked the fourth time in 1987 that the Birds trailed in a game and went on to win. The 31-27 defeat of the eventual Super Bowl champs snapped Washington's five-game winning streak. After being tied at 7-7 entering the 2nd quarter, the Birds fell behind 21-7 before answering back with a TD pass from Cunningham to Mike Quick and a Paul McFadden FG to narrow their halftime deficit to 21-17. Midway through the 4th quarter, Cunningham completed a 32-yard pass to Quick to take a 23-21 lead. The Birds, however, surrendered a go-ahead scoring toss from Redskin QB Jay Schroeder to WR Gary Clark with just 2:29 remaining. Cunningham (286 yards, 3TDs passing; 80 yards rushing) then engineered a 77-yard scoring drive capped by a 40-yard TD pass to Garrity with 1:06 left on the clock.
