

# TREY BROWN

## DIRECTOR OF COLLEGE SCOUTING

7TH YEAR IN NFL / 4TH IN PHILADELPHIA

Trey Brown was named the Eagles' director of college scouting on May 11, 2016. Brown, who now enters his fourth season in Philadelphia, previously served as the team's assistant director of college scouting in 2015.

Brown originally joined the Eagles as a west coast area scout during the 2013 offseason after spending the previous three seasons with the New England Patriots, holding the position of west coast area scout from 2011-12 after one season as a scouting assistant with the team in 2010.

Prior to joining the Pats, Brown was signed by the Chicago Bears as a rookie free agent out of UCLA in 2008 and also played one season with the New York Sentinels of the UFL in 2009.

A four-year letterman at cornerback for the Bruins, Brown earned second-team Walter Camp All-American honors and was named a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, given annually to the nation's top defensive back, in 2007.

A native of Overland Park, KS, Brown graduated from UCLA in 2007 with a bachelor's degree in political science. He attended Blue Valley Northwest (KS) High School where he lettered in football, basketball and baseball.

Brown and his wife, Brooke, were married in 2012 and have a daughter, Maddison. His father, Theotis, was a star running back at UCLA and played in the NFL for the Kansas City Chiefs, Seattle Seahawks and St. Louis Cardinals.
