After spending 14 seasons with the Eagles athletic training staff, Chris Peduzzi was named the team's head athletic trainer during the 2013 offseason.

As an assistant on one of the finest training staffs in professional sports, Peduzzi was a member of a department that was recognized by their peers as the NFL's top training staff following the 2010 season.

Peduzzi (born 4/23/71) joined the Eagles in 1999 from West Chester University, where he served as the program's football athletic trainer. Prior to that, he was an intern for the Pittsburgh Steelers from 1996-98. In the spring of 1997, Peduzzi served as assistant athletic trainer with the Scottish Claymores of NFL Europe.

A native of Johnstown, PA, Peduzzi graduated from Virginia Tech with a B.S. in sports medicine and a M.A. in education. While at Virginia Tech, he served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer from 1995-97 and was a linebacker on the Hokies football team from 1990-94. He also earned the Hitachi Promise of Tomorrow post-graduate scholarship from the College Football Association.

Chris and his wife, Cathy, reside in Lafayette Hill, PA with their daughters, Sarah and Brooke. He is a certified athletic trainer and a member of the National Athletic Trainers Association, Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers Society and the Professional Football Athletic Trainers Society.
