A versatile offensive lineman out of Oregon State, Isaac Seumalo was drafted by the Eagles in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft. Seumalo (pronounced Say-u-mah-low), made 37 starts for the Beavers during his career, opening 23 contests at C, nine at RG, three at LT and two at RT. A standout at Corvallis (OR) HS, Seumalo was rated as the No. 2 offensive lineman in the nation by *SuperPrep*.

**BIRDSEED**

- Numerous members of the Seumalo family have ties to Oregon State athletics. Isaac's brother, Andrew, is currently a grad assistant for the Beavers and played defensive tackle for OSU from 2009-2012. Isaac and Andrew teamed up for one season when Isaac was a freshman and Andrew was a senior. The lone daughter in the family, Isaac's sister Jessi plays volleyball for the Beavers. The family tree ties to OSU start with Isaac's father, Joe, who coached football at OSU and is currently the defensive line coach at Arizona State
- A former d-lineman at Hawai'i, Joe Seumalo enjoyed a pro career for the Calgary Stampeders, Ottawa Roughriders and the Edmonton Eskimos of the CFL, and the Rhein Fire of NFL Europe

**COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS**

- Made 37 career starts at Oregon State, opening contests at every position on the offensive line except for left guard
- Sat out the 2014 season while recovering from a foot injury, but returned to the field as a redshirt junior in 2015 and went on to start all 12 games for the Beavers (nine at RG, three at LT). Prior to the season, was named to the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award watch lists and finished the year with All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention and Pac-12 All-Academic First team honors
- Started 10 games at center and two games at RT as a sophomore in 2013, earning Pac-12 All-Conference Second Team honors, while also being named to the Capital One Academic All-District team and the Pac-12 All-Academic First Team
- In 2012, became the first freshman starting center for Oregon State since Roger Levasa in 1978. Was just one of two true freshmen in the country to start their team's season opener at center. Earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention and was named Freshman All-America by *Phil Steele* and *CBSSports.com*

**PERSONAL**

- Was rated a four-star prospect by *Rivals.com* and the the No. 2 offensive lineman in the country by *SuperPrep* after playing both offensive and defensive line at Corvallis (OR) High School
- In both his junior and senior seasons, was named 5A First-Team All-State as both an offensive and defensive lineman. Notched 94 tackles and nine sacks as a senior and was named the offensive line MVP of the 2011 Stanford Nike Camp. Was also an Under Armour and ESPN All-American
- Son of Joe and Karen Seumalo. Has three brothers, Andrew, Levi and Noah, and a sister, Jessi
