Allen Barbre (pronounced BAR-ber) joined the Eagles in 2013 and emerged as a starter in his third season in Philadelphia, opening all 16 games at left guard in 2015. A former fourth-round draft pick of the Packers in 2007, Barbre was a four-year starter at Missouri Southern State. Barbre signed a three-year contract extension during the 2014 offseason.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

- Started at RT vs. GB (11/28), at Cin. (12/4) and vs. Was. (12/11) in place of injured starter Halapoulivaati Vaitai
- Returned to the starting lineup in Week 11 at Sea. (11/20) after missing the previous two contests due to a hamstring injury. Opened the game at LG and moved to RT late in the fourth quarter when starter Halapoulivaati Vaitai left with an injury
- Made a touchdown-saving tackle in the team's Week 7 win vs. Min. (10/23). Following a first-quarter interception by Eagles QB Carson Wentz, tackled Vikings S Andrew Sendejo at the Philadelphia 2-yard line to keep Minnesota out of the end zone. Three plays later, Eagles S Rodney McLeod intercepted Vikings QB Sam Bradford in the end zone to keep Minnesota off the board

- Re-injured his hamstring in the first half vs. NYG (12/22), did not return to the game and was inactive for the season finale vs. Dal. (1/1)
- Inactive at Bal. (12/18) with a hamstring injury
- Injured his hamstring vs. Was. (12/11) and did not return to the game
- Was inactive at NYG (11/6) and vs. Atl. (11/13) due to a hamstring injury suffered at Dal. (10/30)
- Sustained a hamstring injury in the first quarter at Dal. (10/30) and did not return to the game

BIRDSEED

- In September 2016, Barbre was inducted into the Missouri Southern Athletics Hall of Fame. As a senior in 2006, he was named a consensus All-American, All-MIAA and All-Region first-team selection as a senior in 2006
- Became the highest drafted player ever from Missouri Southern when he was selected by the Packers in the 4th round of the 2007 Draft (119th overall)

BIRDSEED - Cont.

- Says the biggest influence on his life and career is his high school coach, Larry Bunn. "Coach Bunn saw something in me and made sure I was headed in the right direction. He got to me at a young age and made sure I was doing the right things."
- Barbre comes from Native American heritage as his great-great-grandfather Eli Barbry was a Chief of the Tunica-Biloxi Indian Tribe of Louisiana. Barbre is very fond of his heritage and is honored to be part of Native American culture. His grandfather currently lives on the Tunica-Biloxi Indian Reservation in Marksville, Louisiana
- Barbre has rarely handled the football during his career, but he fondly remembers the last time he found the end zone. As a junior in 2005 at Missouri Southern, Barbre scored a touchdown on a 4-yard rush in the first quarter of a win vs. Truman State. Although his touchdown was the first of five on the day for the Lions, Barbre's score meant much more than the rest. On the Tuesday prior to the game, Missouri Southern Head Coach John Ware passed away from a heart attack. Ware, who played offensive line for Drake University, had spent 19 years coaching at Truman before taking the head coaching job at Missouri Southern in 2004. "As a tribute to Coach Ware, we lined up in a formation made up only of offensive lineman," recalls Barbre. "I lined up as quarterback, I took the snap from the shotgun and ran it in. It was pretty neat."
- After one of his wife's good friends survived a cancer scare, Barbre decided he wanted to become involved with Camp Quality in Missouri. Camp Quality is a program focused on caring for the emotional needs of children with cancer and their families
- Believes that hauling hay when he was younger has helped him succeed on the football field: "It made me mentally tough and gave me the ability to deal with the heat."

IN THE TRENCHES

- **Best part of being an offensive lineman:** "You get to be dirty and nasty and get away with it."
- **Best and worst part of being 6-4, 310 pounds:** "Best - plain and simple, I get to play football for a living. Worst - trying to find a tree stand that I can fit into when I go hunting."
