Originally signed by the Eagles as a rookie free agent in 2016, **Byron Marshall** was a standout RB and WR at Oregon, amassing 3,170 scrimmage yards (1,877 rushing; 1,293 receiving) and 27 total TDs (19 rushing, 8 receiving) in 42 career games. A three-year letterman with the Ducks, Marshall became the first player in Pac-12 history to total 1,000+ career rushing yards and 1,000+ career receiving yards.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Led the Eagles with career highs in rush attempts (10) and rushing yards (42) vs. Dal. (1/1/17)

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Prior to his senior season in 2015, was named to the Biletnikoff Award and Paul Hornung Award watch lists
- As a junior in 2014, received Pac-12 all-conference honorable mention after pacing the Ducks with a career-high 1,003 receiving yards on 74 receptions. Became just the 10th receiver in Oregon history to produce 1,000 yards in a single season
- Posted the top receiving performance of his junior campaign vs. Ohio State in the BCS National Championship game, where he totaled a career-high 169 yards and 1 TD
- Earned honorable mention Pac-12 honors as a sophomore in 2013, leading the Ducks with career highs in rushing attempts (168), rushing yards (1,038) and rushing TDs (14), averaging 6.2 yards per carry. Rushed for 100+ yards six times, including a career-high 192 yards and a career-high-tying 3 TDs in the 62-38 victory vs. Washington State (10/19/13)

FAMILY TIES

Marshall is the youngest of three children, all of whom have had successful athletic careers. His older brother, Cameron (pictured above), was a running back at Arizona State and finished his four-year career ranked 7th in school history with 2,700 rushing yards. In 2011, Cameron notched a Sun Devils single-season record with 8 rushing TDs. Cameron has since spent time with the Miami Dolphins, Winnipeg Blue Bombers and Seattle Seahawks.

Marshall's older sister, Dahlys (pictured right), ran track at the University of Arizona, where she was a sprinter and hurdler for the Wildcats.

It's no mystery as to why the Marshall children have excelled in athletics, as their father, Greg, has a strong resume as a professional strength and conditioning coach. Greg, who served as an assistant strength coach for the San Francisco 49ers from 2007-10, is the owner and head coach of Marshall Sports Performance and Fitness.



HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT

Marshall played running back at Valley Christian High School, where he was a four-year letterman. As a junior, Marshall was selected to the all-Central Coast first-team after carrying the ball 145 times for 1,360 yards and 20 TDs as a junior. He was named the Cal-Hi Sports State Sophomore of the Year after rushing for 1,035 yards and 17 TDs.

Marshall also lettered in track in high school. He placed 3rd at the National Indoor Championships at 60 meters and ranked first among sophomores in California with a time of 10.67 seconds in the 100 meters.

BIRDSEED

Marshall, who is the son of Greg and Tammie Marshall, began playing football for the Coyote Creek Wildcats when he was 6 years old. He majored in journalism and communications at Oregon and plans to finish his degree in the spring of 2017.
