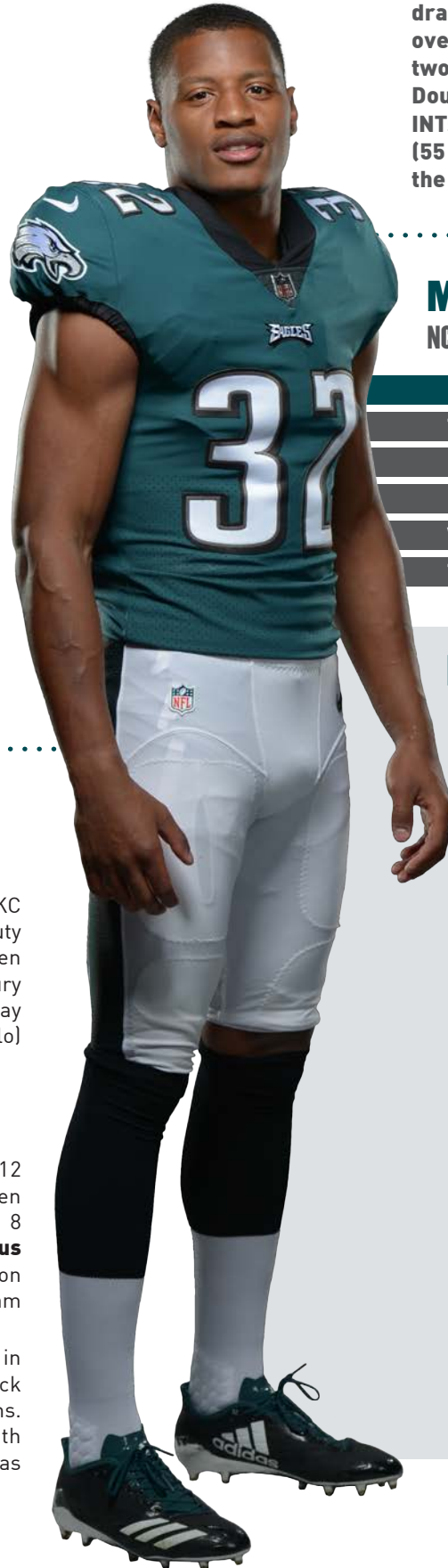

Rasul Douglas (pronounced RAH-sool) was drafted by the Eagles in the 3rd round (99th overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft following a two-year collegiate career at West Virginia. Douglas, who tied for the NCAA lead with 8 INTs as a senior in 2016, registered 78 tackles (55 solo), 9 INTs and 2 FFs in 24 games with the Mountaineers.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2017 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (1/0)

- Played in his first pro game at KC (9/17/17) and was pressed into duty on defense after starting CB Jaylen Watkins suffered a hamstring injury early in the game. Finished the day with a team-high 6 tackles (5 solo) and a pass defended

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Collected first-team All-Big 12 honors as a senior in 2016, when he tied for the NCAA lead with 8 INTs (also Florida State's **Tarvarus McFadden**). Returned an interception 54 yards for a TD in a win vs. Brigham Young (9/24/16)
- Played in 11 games as a junior in 2015, adding depth at cornerback and seeing action on special teams. Recorded his first-career INT with the Mountaineers in a win at Kansas (11/21/15)

BIRDSEED

- Is one of seven siblings raised by his grandmother in East Orange, NJ
- Credits his little league baseball coach, Mike Davis, for helping turn his life around. Davis was also the P.A. announcer for East Orange HS and a mentor for at-risk youth. "He was the one who took me out of the streets. He made sure we did what we had to do."
- Nassau Community College had no dorms, so Douglas lived in an apartment eight miles from campus and took the bus to and from school and practice each day. On his own financially, Douglas slept on the floor and battled hunger
- Would wait until the end of the day to eat and often ordered off the dollar menu at McDonald's, eating half of the meal and saving the rest for later. "Every time I eat, I always think I'm making up a meal that I missed in junior college ... It definitely fuels me all the time, just thinking about what I went through, practicing on an empty stomach, going to school on an empty stomach. You can't even focus. So that definitely makes me want to play all-out all the time."
