Originally selected by the Eagles with the 2nd-overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft, **Carson Wentz** established a franchise and all-time rookie record with 379 completions in his debut season. Wentz also threw for the 4th-most yards (3,782) in Eagles single-season history, trailing only **Donovan McNabb** in 2008 (3,916) and 2004 (3,875) and **Randall Cunningham** in 1988 (3,808).

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

### 2017 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (2/2)

- Since 1950, only four Eagles QBs have thrown for 300+ yards and 2+ TDs in each of the first two games of the season: Wentz (2017), **Donovan McNabb** (2006), **Randall Cunningham** (1994) and **Ron Jaworski** (1982)
- Totaled 333 passing yards and a career-high 55 rushing yards at KC (9/7/17), joining **Michael Vick** (11/15/10 at Was.; 10/2/11 vs. SF) as the only Eagles QBs to throw for 325+ yards and run for 50+ yards in a single game
- Connected with **Nelson Agholor** on a 58-yard TD on the opening drive at Was. (9/10/17). Marked the 2nd-longest TD pass of his NFL career (73 yards to **Darren Sproles** on 9/25/16 vs. Pit.)

### 2016 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (16/16)

- Set a franchise and NFL rookie record with 379 completions



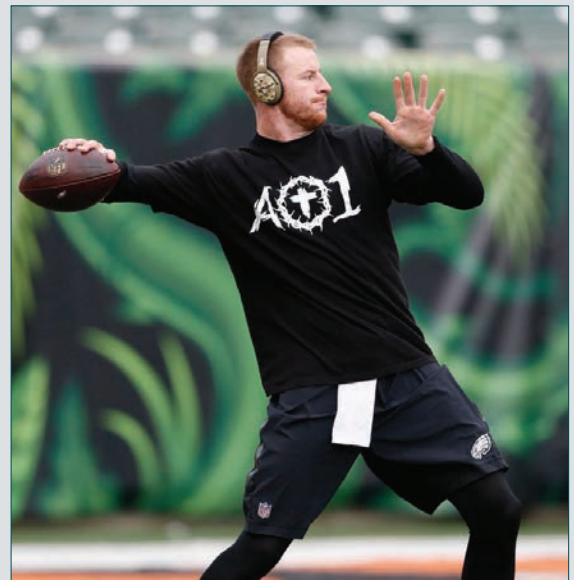
## CARSON WENTZ A01 FOUNDATION

In July 2017, Wentz launched the **Carson Wentz A01 Foundation**, a nonprofit with a mission to “demonstrate the love of God by providing opportunities and support for the less fortunate and those in need.” The foundation focuses on three main objectives that reflect some of Wentz’s deepest passions in life - his faith, his enthusiasm for the outdoors and his avid love for dogs.

- **Service dogs:** To support youth in the Philadelphia area by providing service dogs to assist with their development and quality of life
- **Hunting and outdoor opportunities:** To provide hunting and outdoor opportunities for individuals with physical challenges, the underserved and military veterans living in the Midwest

“A01” stands for “*Audience of One*,” which is a motto that helps shape Wentz’s life. “It means living for the Lord as my audience, trying to glorify everything. It’s a good reminder for me every day.”

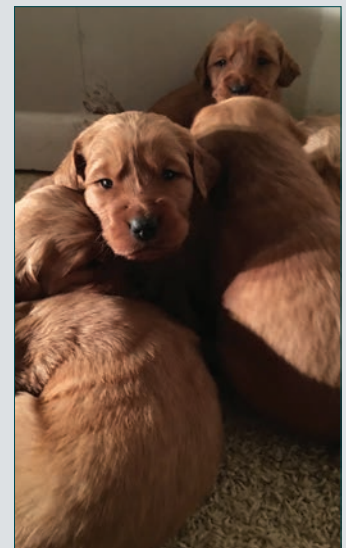


## MISSION OF HOPE

The trip moved Wentz so much that he is already planning on going back.

Wentz has been a dog lover ever since getting his golden retriever, Henley, when he was in college at North Dakota State. Henley gave birth to eight puppies in November 2016. In total, nine golden retrievers lived in Wentz’s home for more than a month before he gave seven away to family and friends. Wentz kept one puppy and named him Jersey.

“I love dogs and being around them and getting to work with Jersey and train him to hopefully be a really good hunting dog. It’s a fun process getting away from everything else going on in life and just getting to spend time with them.”

## THE GUNSLINGER

Even though he grew up a Minnesota Vikings fan, Wentz idolized Green Bay Packers legend Brett Favre. “I loved watching Favre play. I loved his gunslinger mentality and just the way he had fun. He was fun to watch and he played the game and enjoyed it. I think he played it the right way.”

Wentz, who was born in Raleigh, NC, is the son of Doug Wentz and Cathy Anhalt. His father, Doug, played linebacker at Northern State University in Aberdeen, SD. His brother, Zach, was a four-year starting pitcher and infielder at North Dakota State, and his cousin, Conner, is currently a tight end for the Bison.

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Also posted Eagles rookie records in pass attempts (607), passing yards (3,782), completion percentage (62.4%), passing TDs (16) and passer rating (79.3)
- Produced the 4th-most passing yards (3,782) in Eagles single-season history, behind **Donovan McNabb** in 2008 (3,916) and 2004 (3,875) and **Randall Cunningham** in 1988 (3,808)
- His 3,782 passing yards were the 4th-highest total in NFL rookie history, trailing only **Andrew Luck** in 2012 (4,374), **Cam Newton** in 2011 (4,051) and **Jameis Winston** in 2015 (4,042)
- Became the first Eagles QB to start all 16 regular-season games since **Donovan McNabb** in 2008
- Attempted 134 consecutive passes without an INT from 9/11-10/9/16, marking the 3rd-longest streak to begin a career in NFL history, trailing only **Dak Prescott** (176, 9/11-10/16/16) and **Tom Brady** (162, 11/23/00-10/28/01)
- Earned **NFL Rookie of the Week** accolades after registering a career-high 75.8% (25-of-33) completion percentage along with 238 yards and 2 TDs at Det. (10/9/16)

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Named **NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month** for September 2016 after completing 66-of-102 (64.7%) passes for 769 yards, 5 TDs, 0 INTs and a 103.8 passer rating. Became the first player in team history to earn the award
- Garnered **NFC Offensive Player of the Week** and **NFL Rookie of the Week** honors after going 23-of-31 (72.4%) for 301 yards, 2 TDs and a franchise-rookie-record 125.9 passer rating in the 34-3 win vs. Pit. (9/25/16). Became the first Eagles rookie to be named NFC Offensive Player of the Week since **Charlie Garner** in 1994
- Selected as **NFL Rookie of the Week** after completing 22-of-37 (59.5%) passes for 278 yards, 2 TDs and a 101.0 passer rating in his debut vs. Cle. (9/11/16). His 278 yards were the most ever by an Eagles rookie in their first career start
- Became the first Eagles rookie QB to start in a season opener since **Davey O'Brien** in 1939 and the first to play on opening day since **Randall Cunningham** in 1985





## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Named the Eagles starting QB just eight days before the season opener after the team traded **Sam Bradford** to the Vikings on 9/3/16 in exchange for a 1st-round pick in 2017 (DE **Derek Barnett**) and a 4th-round pick in 2018

## NOTES TO KNOW

- Selected by the Eagles with the No. 2-overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft, becoming the franchise's highest-drafted player since **Donovan McNabb** in 1999 (also 2nd overall)
- Only five QBs have been chosen by Philadelphia in the 1st round: Wentz, **Donovan McNabb** (1999), **John Reaves** (1972), **Frank Tripucka** (1949) and **Davey O'Brien** (1939)
- Since 1971, only seven non-FBS QBs have been 1st-round picks: Wentz (North Dakota State, 2nd, 2016), **Joe Flacco** (Delaware, 18th, 2008), **Steve McNair** (Alcorn State, 3rd, 1995), **Ken O'Brien** (UC Davis, 24th, 1983), **Phil Simms** (Morehead State, 7th, 1979), **Doug Williams** (Grambling State, 17th, 1978), **Dan Pastorini** (Santa Clara, 3rd, 1971)

## COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- A member of five straight NCAA Division I FCS national championship teams (2011-15) at North Dakota State, including two as a starter in 2014 and 2015
- Captained the Bison to a 20-3 overall record (.870 winning percentage) in games that he started. Finished 3rd in school history in career passing yards (5,115), passing TDs (45), completions (392), completion percentage (64.1%) and passer efficiency rating (153.9)
- Started the first six games of his senior year in 2015, but sustained a wrist injury and missed the following eight contests. Returned to practice in December and was cleared to play in the national championship game. Led North Dakota State to a 37-10 victory over Jacksonville State
- Earned the starting job as a junior in 2014 and opened all 16 games under center for the Bison. Led North Dakota State to a 15-1 season that culminated with a 29-27 defeat of Illinois State in the national championship game. Produced three fourth-quarter comebacks in the playoffs
- Posted a career year in 2014, setting single-season school records in passing yards (3,111), pass attempts (358) and completions (228), while throwing 25 TDs against 10 INTs
