## CARSON WENTZ A01 FOUNDATION

In July 2017, Wentz launched the **Carson Wentz A01 Foundation**, a nonprofit with a mission to “demonstrate the love of God by providing opportunities and support for the less fortunate and those in need.” The foundation focuses on three main objectives that reflect some of Wentz’s deepest passions in life - his faith, his enthusiasm for the outdoors and his avid love for dogs.

- **Service dogs:** To support youth in the Philadelphia area by providing service dogs to assist with their development and quality of life
- **Hunting and outdoor opportunities:** To provide hunting and outdoor opportunities for individuals with physical challenges, the underserved and military veterans living in the Midwest
- **Underprivileged youth:** To care for and provide food, shelter and educational opportunities for underprivileged youth living abroad

“A01” stands for “*Audience of One*,” which is a motto that helps shape Wentz’s life. “It means living for the Lord as my audience, trying to glorify everything. It’s a good reminder for me every day.”

## MISSION OF HOPE

In May 2017, Wentz traveled to Port-au-Prince, Haiti, with **Mission of Hope**, a Christian organization that seeks transformative change for the people of Haiti. During the weekend-long mission, Wentz embraced a whole new culture while sharing his faith, playing with kids and helping paint homes in the community.

“It was very eye-opening to see how much need there really is, and how they’re lacking so many things materialistically. But emotionally and mentally, it was one of the most joyful communities. It was one of the most joyful things I’ve seen. I think the biggest thing I learned about myself was life isn’t all about stuff. Going there and seeing it gave me an entirely different perspective just because they don’t have much at all.”

*In September 2017, the Carson Wentz A01 Foundation granted funds to Mission of Hope to help build a multi-purpose sports complex and education center on its campus. Through the sports programs and facilities, children will have access to educational tutoring, provided meals and vitamins to support nutrition, and have a safe place with power and internet to study when they are not in the classroom.*



## NFLPA COMMUNITY MVP

Wentz received NFLPA Community MVP honors for Week 3 of 2017 after he donated \$120,000 to **Canine Partners for Life** to secure specially trained service dogs for people with disabilities. The funding will help cover the costs necessary to raise, train and place more CPL service dogs around Philadelphia.

## THE GUNSLINGER

Even though he grew up a Vikings fan, Wentz idolized Packers legend Brett Favre. In 2016, Wentz was a guest on Favre’s SiriusXM radio show, but he is still waiting for the opportunity to meet his favorite player. “I loved watching Favre play. I loved his gunslinger mentality and just the way he had fun. He was fun to watch and he played the game and enjoyed it. I think he played it the right way.”

## MAN’S BEST FRIEND

Wentz has been a dog lover ever since getting his golden retriever, Henley, when he was in college at North Dakota State. Henley gave birth to eight puppies in November 2016. Nine golden retrievers lived in Wentz’s home for more than a month before he gave seven away to family and friends. Wentz kept one puppy and named him Jersey.

“I love dogs and being around them and getting to work with Jersey and train him to hopefully be a really good hunting dog. It’s a fun process getting away from everything else going on in life and just getting to spend time with them.”



## BIRDSEED

Wentz, who was born in Raleigh, NC, is the son of Doug Wentz and Cathy Anhalt. His father, Doug, played linebacker at Northern State University in Aberdeen, SD. His brother, Zach, was a four-year starting pitcher and infielder at North Dakota State, and his cousin, Conner, is currently a tight end for the Bison.

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

### 2017 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (13/13)

- Established a new single-season franchise record with a career-high 33 passing TDs, breaking the previous mark of 32 set by **Sonny Jurgensen** in 1961
- His 33 passing TDs are tied with **Daunte Culpepper** in 2000 for the 4th-most ever by an NFL QB in his first or second season, trailing only **Dan Marino** in 1984 (48), **Kurt Warner** in 1999 (41) and **Blake Bortles** in 2015 (35)
- Is just the third QB in NFL history to throw 33+ TDs and no more than 7 INTs through 13 games, joining **Tom Brady** in 2015 (33-6) and 2007 (45-5) and **Aaron Rodgers** in 2014 (35-3) and 2011 (39-6)
- Has recorded the 2nd-most 4+ passing TD games (4) in Eagles single-season history, trailing only **Donovan McNabb** in 2004 (5). His 6 games with 3+ passing TDs are tied with **Norm Snead** in 1967 for the most such games in Eagles single-season history
- Has thrown 1+ TD and no more than 1 INT in 15 straight games, which is tied for the 6th-longest streak by an NFL QB since 1950, trailing only **Matt Ryan** (21 games, 12/20/15-9/17/17), **Aaron Rodgers** (19 games, 12/26/10-9/13/12), **Vinny Testaverde** (19 games, 11/30/97-9/17/00), **Steve Young** (17 games, 10/9/94-10/15/95) and **Trent Green** (16 games, 11/1/98-11/26/00)
- Ranks 4th in the NFL in passer rating (101.9), behind **Tom Brady** (105.2), **Alex Smith** (104.4) and **Drew Brees** (104.2) (min. 400 attempts)
- Posted a career-high-tying 4 TDs and 100.8 passer rating in the 43-35 win at LAR (12/10/17)

- Registered a career-high-tying 4 TDs and posted a 118.7 passer rating in the 51-23 win vs. Den. (11/5/17). Became the first Eagles QB to throw 4+ TDs with 0 INTs in a single game since **Nick Foles** (7-0) on 11/3/13 at Oakland
- Selected as **NFC Offensive Player of the Month** for the first time in his career after completing 89-of-148 (60.1%) attempts for 1,247 yards, 14 TDs, 3 INTs and a 110.4 passer rating and leading the Eagles to a perfect 5-0 record in October. Became the first Eagle to win the award since **LeSean McCoy** in December 2013 and the first Eagles QB since **Nick Foles** in November 2013
- Named **NFC Offensive Player of the Week** for the second time in his career (also Week 3 of 2016) and voted **Castrol EDGE Clutch Performer of the Week** after completing 17-of-25 (68.0%) attempts for 268 yards, a career-high-tying 4 TDs, 1 INT and a 126.3 passer rating and rushing for a career-high 63 yards in the 34-24 *Monday Night Football* victory vs. Was. (10/23/17)
- Earned **FedEx Air Player of the Week** accolades after finishing 16-of-30 (53.3%) for 222 yards, 3 TDs, 0 INTs and a 110.7 passer rating in the 28-23 win at Car. (10/12/17) on *Thursday Night Football*
- Voted **FedEx Air Player of the Week** after posting career highs with 4 passing TDs and a 128.3 passer rating in the 34-7 win vs. Ari. (10/8/17). Became the youngest Eagles QB to throw 4+ TDs in a single game since a 24-year-old **Donovan McNabb** on 12/10/00 at Cle. (also 4)
- Totaled 333 passing yards and a career-high 55 rushing yards at KC (9/7/17), joining **Michael Vick** (11/15/10 at Was.; 10/2/11 vs. SF) as the only Eagles QBs to throw for 325+ yards and run for 50+ yards in a single game

### 2016 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (16/16)

- Set a franchise and NFL rookie record with 379 completions
- Also posted Eagles rookie records in pass attempts (607), passing yards (3,782), completion percentage (62.4%), passing TDs (16) and passer rating (79.3)
- Produced the 4th-most passing yards (3,782) in Eagles single-season history, behind **Donovan McNabb** in 2008 (3,916) and 2004 (3,875) and **Randall Cunningham** in 1988 (3,808). His 3,782 yards were the 4th-most in NFL rookie history, trailing only **Andrew Luck** in 2012 (4,374), **Cam Newton** in 2011 (4,051) and **Jameis Winston** in 2015 (4,042)
- Became the first Eagles QB to start all 16 regular-season games since **Donovan McNabb** in 2008
- Attempted 134 consecutive passes without an INT from 9/11-10/9/16, marking the 3rd-longest streak to begin a career in NFL history, trailing only **Dak Prescott** (176, 9/11-10/16/16) and **Tom Brady** (162, 11/23/00-10/28/01)
- Earned **Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week** accolades after registering a career-high 75.8% (25-of-33) completion percentage along with 238 yards and 2 TDs at Det. (10/9/16)
- Named **NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month** for September 2016 after completing 66-of-102 (64.7%) passes for 769 yards, 5 TDs, 0 INTs and a 103.8 passer rating. Became the first player in team history to earn the award
- Garnered **NFC Offensive Player of the Week** and **Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week** honors after going 23-of-31 (72.4%) for 301 yards, 2 TDs and a franchise-rookie-record 125.9 passer rating in the 34-3 win vs. Pit. (9/25/16). Became the first Eagles rookie to be named NFC Offensive Player of the Week since **Charlie Garner** in 1994
- Selected as **Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week** after completing 22-of-37 (59.5%) passes for 278 yards, 2 TDs and a 101.0 passer rating in his debut vs. Cle. (9/11/16). His 278 yards were the most ever by an Eagles rookie QB in their first start
- Became the first Eagles rookie QB to start in a season opener since **Davey O'Brien** in 1939 and the first to play on opening day since **Randall Cunningham** in 1985
- Named the Eagles starting QB just eight days before the season opener after the team traded **Sam Bradford** to the Vikings on 9/3/16 in exchange for a 1st-round pick in 2017 (DE **Derek Barnett**) and a 4th-round pick in 2018

## NOTES TO KNOW

- Selected by the Eagles with the No. 2-overall pick in the 2016 NFL Draft, becoming the franchise's highest-drafted player since **Donovan McNabb** in 1999 (also 2nd overall)
- Only five QBs have been chosen by Philadelphia in the 1st round: Wentz, **Donovan McNabb** (1999), **John Reaves** (1972), **Frank Tripucka** (1949) and **Davey O'Brien** (1939)
- Since 1971, only seven non-FBS QBs have been 1st-round picks: Wentz (North Dakota State, 2nd, 2016), **Joe Flacco** (Delaware, 18th, 2008), **Steve McNair** (Alcorn State, 3rd, 1995), **Ken O'Brien** (UC Davis, 24th, 1983), **Phil Simms** (Morehead State, 7th, 1979), **Doug Williams** (Grambling State, 17th, 1978), **Dan Pastorini** (Santa Clara, 3rd, 1971)

## COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- A member of five straight NCAA Division I FCS national championship teams (2011-15) at North Dakota State, including two as a starter in 2014 and 2015
- Captained the Bison to a 20-3 overall record (.870 winning percentage) in games that he started. Finished 3rd in school history in career passing yards (5,115), passing TDs (45), completions (392), completion percentage (64.1%) and passer efficiency rating (153.9)
- Started the first six games of his senior year in 2015, but sustained a wrist injury and missed the following eight contests. Returned to practice in December and was cleared to play in the national championship game. Led North Dakota State to a 37-10 victory over Jacksonville State
- Earned the starting job as a junior in 2014 and opened all 16 games under center for the Bison. Led North Dakota State to a 15-1 season that culminated with a 29-27 defeat of Illinois State in the national championship game. Produced three fourth-quarter comebacks in the playoffs
- Posted a career year in 2014, setting single-season school records in passing yards (3,111), pass attempts (358) and completions (228), while throwing 25 TDs against 10 INTs
