Originally selected by the Bengals in the 5th round (153rd overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft, **Jake Elliott** was signed by the Eagles from Cincinnati's practice squad following a Week 1 injury to **Caleb Sturgis**. In Week 3 vs. N.Y. Giants, Elliott connected on a franchise-record 61-yard FG to win the game, marking the longest FG ever by a rookie and tying for the 3rd-longest walk-off FG in NFL history. Elliott enjoyed a record-setting career at the University of Memphis and finished among the Top 10 in FBS scoring history by a kicker with 445 career points.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2017 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (15/0, 3/0)

- Owns the franchise record for most 50+ yard FGs (5) in a single season
- Tied with **David Akers** in 2004 for the most 40+ yard FGs (17) in Eagles single-season history
- Converted 3 FGs from 25, 42 and 46 yards in **Super Bowl LII** at NE (2/4/18). His 46-yarder gave the Eagles a 41-33 lead with 1:05 remaining and was the longest FG in the Super Bowl since Saints K **Garrett Hartley** on 2/7/10 vs. Indianapolis (47 yards)

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Connected on each of his 3 FG attempts in the 15-10 win vs. Atl. (1/13/18) in the Divisional Round, including a 53-yard FG, which is the longest FG in Eagles playoff history (previously 51 yards by **David Akers** on 1/4/09 at Minnesota). Also gave the Eagles a 12-10 lead in the third quarter when he kicked a go-ahead FG from 37 yards
- Has made 4 game-winning FGs (including playoffs): Week 3 vs. NYG, Week 14 at LAR, Week 16 vs. Oak. and the Divisional Round vs. Atl.
- Connected on a 48-yard FG to give the Eagles a 13-10 lead with 22 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter of the 19-10 win vs. Oak. (12/25/17)
- Made 12 consecutive FGs (46, 61, 45, 40, 53, 47, 36, 28, 50, 48, 50, 42), including 4 straight from 50+ yards, from Weeks 3-7. During that stretch, his FGs averaged 45.5 yards in distance
- Posted career highs with 4 FGs (45, 40, 53, 47) and 14 points at LAC (10/1/17). Became the first Eagles kicker to make 4 FGs of 40+ yards in a single game since **David Akers** on 10/3/04 at Chicago
- Connected on a career-high 4 FGs from 45, 40, 53 and 47 yards in the 26-24 win at L.A. Chargers (10/1/17)
- Named **NFC Special Teams Player of the Week**, **Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week** and **Castrol Edge Clutch Performer of the Week** for his game-winning effort in Week 3
- Kicked a game-winning, franchise-record 61-yard FG as time expired vs. NYG (9/24/17). Converted back-to-back FGs from 46 and 61 yards in the last 0:51 to erase a 24-21 deficit
- His 61-yard FG vs. NYG was the longest FG ever by a rookie and tied for the 7th-longest FG in NFL history, trailing only **Matt Prater** (64 on 12/8/13 vs. Ten.), **David Akers** (63 on 9/9/12 at GB), **Sebastian Janikowski** (63 on 9/12/11 at Den.), **Jason Elam** (63 on 10/25/98 vs. Jax.), **Tom Dempsey** (63 on 11/8/70 vs. Det.) and **Matt Bryant** (62 on 10/22/06 vs. Phi.). Also tied for the 3rd-longest game-ending FG in NFL history, behind Dempsey and Bryant

Elliott prepped at Lyons Township High School (La Grange, IL), which is located outside of Chicago. Elliott connected on 15 of 21 FGs as a senior, as well as 43 of 44 PATs, en route to being named All-Illinois First Team by the *Chicago Tribune*. As a junior, Elliott went 12 for 13 on FGs and 28 for 28 on PATs.

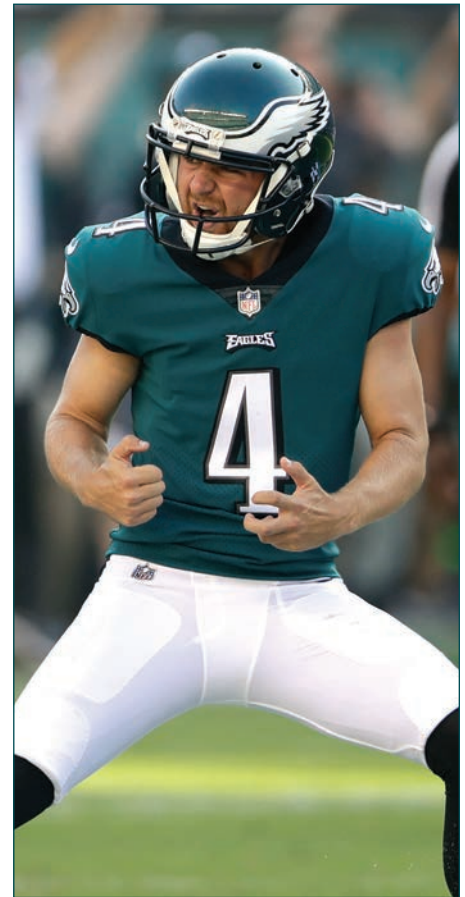
Elliott was named the 2016 American Athletic Conference Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year and received a \$2,000 scholarship for graduate or professional studies. Elliott was a seven-time Dean's List student, three-time AAC All-Academic Team member and was the recipient of Memphis' Zach Curlin Award as the school's top male student-athlete for 2016-17.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Made his NFL debut at KC (9/17/17), converting 2 of 3 FG attempts from 34 and 40 yards. Booted the Eagles' first successful onside kick since 12/30/12 at NYG (**Alex Henery**)

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- First player in American Athletic Conference history to earn first-team all-league honors all four years
- Four-time Lou Groza Award semifinalist (top collegiate placekicker), including finalist recognition in 2015
- Totaled school-best 445 career points, topping **Stephen Gostkowski** (369) and **DeAngelo Williams** (362)
- Became the second player in school history to lead the team in scoring all four years, joining K **John Butler** (1986-89)
- During his four seasons (2013-16) at Memphis, ranked 2nd among NCAA kickers in points (445), trailing only **Zane Gonzalez** (492). Also led the nation with 10 FGs of 50+ yards in that span
- Holds school record for longest FG (56 yards) and kicked 4 of the 5 longest FGs in program history (56, 54, 53, 53)
- In 2016, totaled 121 points, going 21 for 26 on FGs and 58 of 58 on PATs. Led the AAC in FGs made, FG percentage (80.8%) and PAT percentage (100.0%), while finishing second among kickers in scoring. Recorded eight double-digit scoring games. Recorded 64 touchbacks on 92 kickoffs (69.6%) and helped Memphis rank second in the nation in kick return defense (16.04 yards/return)
