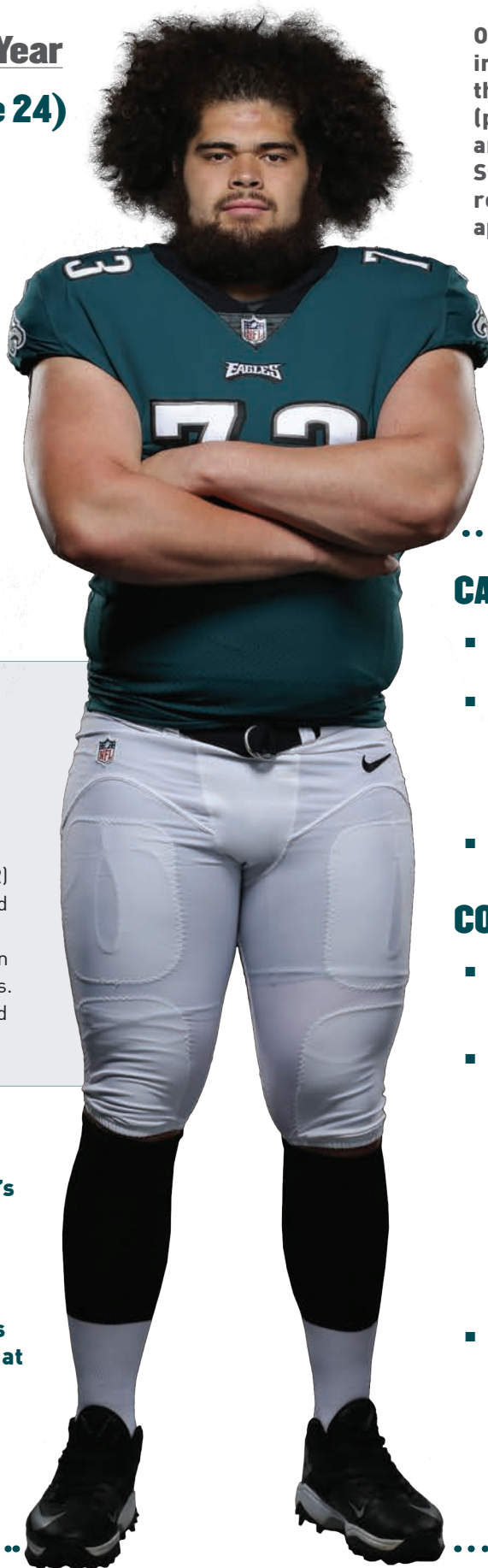

Originally selected by Philadelphia in the 3rd round (79th overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, **Isaac Seumalo** (pronounced SAY-u-MAH-low) was an All-Pac-12 honoree at Oregon State. He has played a key reserve role on the Eagles offensive line, appearing in 23 games and making 6 starts at three positions in his first two seasons.

In his first two seasons, Seumalo has played in 23 games while making 6 starts at three different positions.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Played in a career-high 14 games in 2017, starting 2 games at LG
- Proved to be a key reserve on the offensive line as a rookie in 2016, seeing action in 9 games and starting 4 contests at three different positions (2 at RG, 1 at LG, 1 at RT)
- Made the first start of his career when he opened at RG vs. GB (11/28/16)

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Made 37 career starts at Oregon State, opening contests at every position on the offensive line except for left guard
- Sat out the 2014 season recovering from a foot injury, but returned to the field as a redshirt junior in 2015 and went on to start all 12 games for the Beavers (nine at RG, three at LT). Prior to the season, was named to the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award watch lists and finished the year with All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention and Pac-12 All-Academic First team honors
- Started 10 games at center and two games at RT as a sophomore in 2013, earning Pac-12 All-Conference Second Team honors, while also being named to the Capital One Academic All-District team and the Pac-12 All-Academic First Team

BIRDSEED

Seumalo is the son of Karen and Joe Seumalo and has three brothers (Andrew, Levi and Noah) and one sister (Jessi).

Seumalo prepped at Corvallis (OR) High School, where he was named 5A First-Team All-State as an offensive and defensive lineman in both his junior and senior seasons. He was also an Under Armour and ESPN All-American.

Seumalo's father, Joe, played college football at Hawaii and is currently the defensive line coach at San Jose State. Prior to coaching, Joe played professionally in NFL Europe and the Canadian Football League.

Joe Seumalo and Eagles head coach Doug Pederson were teammates in 1995 with the Rhein Fire.

Seumalo's brother, Andrew, is a GA at the University of Nebraska and played DT for OSU from 2009-2012. Isaac and Andrew teamed up for one season when Isaac was a freshman and Andrew was a senior.

Seumalo's sister, Jessi, played volleyball for the Beavers and is currently a football recruiting GA at her alma mater.
