Sidney Jones was selected by the Eagles in the 2nd round (43rd overall) of the 2017 NFL Draft and made his career debut in Week 17 vs. Dallas. Jones attended the University of Washington, where he was a two-time first-team All-Pac-12 selection (2015-16) and second-team All-America honoree in 2016. In 40 career games with the Huskies, Jones posted 145 tackles, 30 PDs, 9 INTs, 6 FFs and 3 FRs.

2017 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (1/0, 0/0)

- Activated from the Non-Football Injury List (Achilles) to the 53-man roster in Week 17 and recorded 3 tackles (2 solo) in his NFL debut vs. Dal. (12/31/17). Saw action in 29 defensive snaps at cornerback and 7 special teams snaps on the punt return unit

BIRDSEED

Jones prepped at West Covina (CA) High School, where he was named Hacienda League Defensive Player of the Year and earned first-team All-CIF Southern Section Southeast Division honors at defensive back as a senior in 2013. Jones, who played cornerback, free safety, running back and wide receiver while also returning kicks and punts for the Bulldogs, helped lead West Covina into the CIF Southern Section Southeast Division playoffs that year as well.

As a junior in 2012, Jones received first-team All-CIF SS Southeast Division and first-team All-Hacienda League honors at defensive back and helped lead the Bulldogs to the CIF-SS Southeast Division semifinals. As a sophomore in 2011, West Covina finished the season 13-1 and won the CIF-SS Southeast Division, beating La Serna, 84-21, in the championship game. That squad scored 240 points in four postseason contests.
