Patrick Stewart was hired by the Eagles as a national scout in the 2018 offseason.

Prior to joining the Eagles scouting staff, Stewart held multiple positions with the New England Patriots from 2007-17. He was originally hired by New England as a scouting assistant in 2007 and went on to serve as both an area scout (2009, 2013-17) and pro scout (2010-12). He has been a part of two Super Bowl Championship teams (XLIX and LI).

Before entering the NFL, Stewart worked as an assistant director of football operations at Temple University (2006) under head coach Al Golden. Prior to that, he served as a graduate assistant coach at Western Carolina for the 2005 season.

From 2000-04, he worked for Jim Tressel at Ohio State as a student manager while earning his bachelor's degree in Political Science, which he received in 2005.

Stewart and his wife, Whitney, have one son, Theo James.
