Elie Bouka (pronounced Eli B00-kuh) was signed by the Eagles to a reserve/future contract in 2018. The Quebec native originally entered the NFL as an undrafted rookie with the Cardinals in 2016 after appearing in 27 games at the University of Calgary, where he earned CIS All-Canadian honors and was a Canada West All-Star selection.

Bouka's native tongue is French. He learned English while attending football camps growing up and now speaks it fluently.

Bouka was a wide receiver at Cégep Montmorency (Laval, Quebec, Canada), totaling 650 yards on 46 receptions in 2010. Bouka became the first receiver in Montmorency history to be named a Cégep AAA all-star. He also played volleyball at Montmorency.

Bouka played for Team Quebec at the 2010 Canada Cup as a wide receiver and punt returner and helped his team earn a silver medal.
