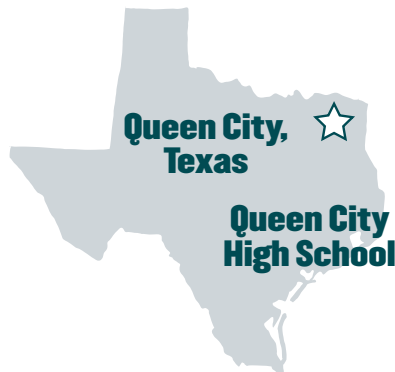

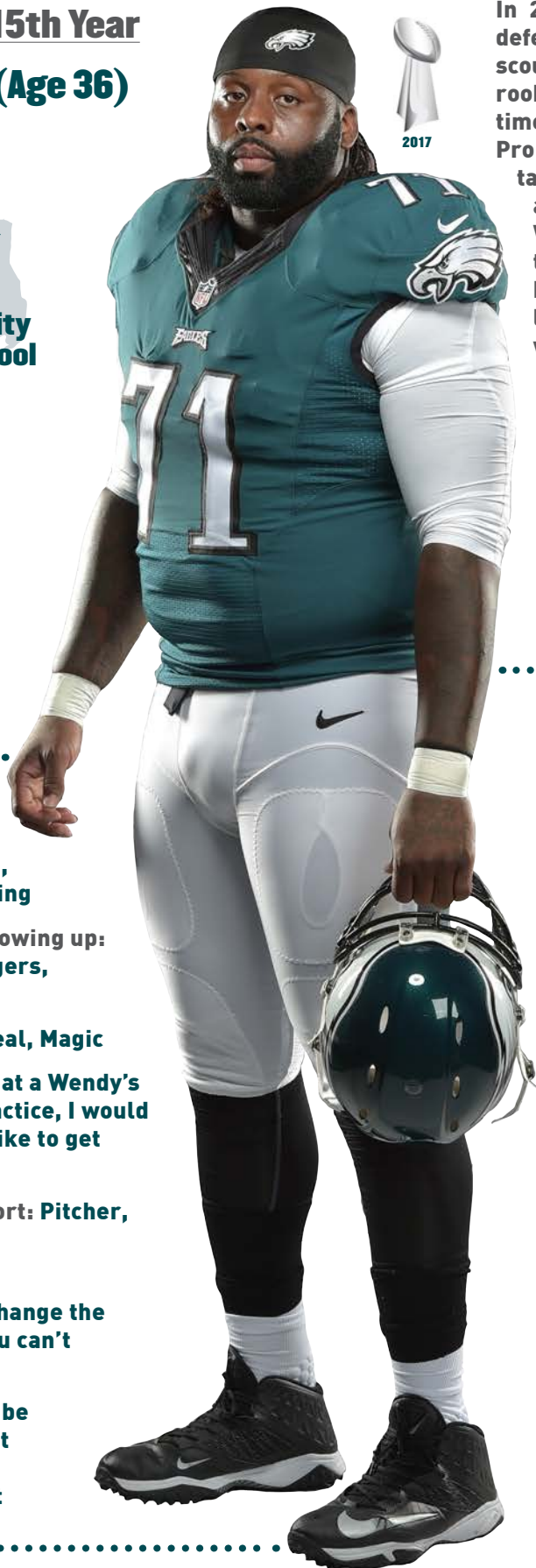

In 2000, Jason Peters was a redshirt defensive lineman laboring on Arkansas' scout team. In 2004, he was an undrafted rookie tight end working to earn playing time in Buffalo. Now, he is a nine-time Pro Bowl and six-time All-Pro offensive tackle who is building his resume for a spot in the Pro Football Hall of Fame. Widely regarded as the best offensive tackle in the NFL, the 15-year veteran has anchored the Eagles offensive line since he was acquired in a trade with Buffalo in 2009.

AN UNCONVENTIONAL PATH

Peters originally signed with the Buffalo Bills in 2004 as a tight end with a signing bonus of \$5,000. He went undrafted despite an impressive workout at the combine, which included a 4.8 time in the 40-yard dash.

He began the 2004 season on the Bills practice squad, but was elevated to the 53-man roster in November and saw action at both tight end and offensive tackle. In a Dec. 19 contest at Cincinnati, Peters started his first career NFL game when the team opened up in a two-TE set. During the contest, he blocked a punt and recovered it in the end zone for a TD (pictured above).

In 2005, Peters made the transition from tight end to tackle and credits former Bills coach **Mike Mularkey** for the career-changing move. "Offensive line was one of our weak points and I remember wanting to get on the field any way I could. Coach Mularkey told me about it and Mouse (offensive line coach **Jim McNally**) and I got to work."

Peters officially made the switch to tackle in the middle of the season and started the final nine games of the year at RT. He went on to open the 2006 season as the starting RT and switched to LT for the final nine games of the season. That year, he was named to Peter King's SI.com All-Pro team. After proving to be the Bills' most dominant offensive lineman in 2006, Peters opened 15 contests at LT in 2007 and garnered Pro Bowl honors for the first time in his career.

In 2009, the Eagles acquired Peters in a trade with Buffalo in exchange for a first-round draft pick in 2009, a fourth-round pick in 2009 and a sixth-round pick in 2010. Since then, Peters has made the Pro Bowl seven times, marking the second-most Pro Bowl berths in franchise history.

EARLY ATHLETICISM

As a 9-year old, Peters was taken out of a baseball game after the umpire and opposing coach were convinced he was too old to play in the league. "I struck out 9 batters in the first three innings. My mother had to go home and get my birth certificate before I was allowed back in the game. After I did, I hit a home run."

Peters attended Queen City (TX) High School and earned All-District and All-Area honors as a defensive end. He also lettered in basketball, averaging 18.4 points per game to garner All-District and All-Area honors.



CUSTOM WHEELS

Peters owns a business in Shreveport, LA, named Greedy Boy Customs. "We do custom car work or on really anything with wheels," said Peters. "We've actually done work on a few golf carts." ... Thanks to his grandfather, Dallas Wiggins, buying and restoring cars has been a passion in Jason's life. "He used to take all these old cars and fix them up. When I was little, I was always hanging around watching him and my uncle, and I got hooked."



BRAND JORDAN

Peters started a collection of Jordans in 2006 and now has a collection of over 2,500 that he displays in one closet in his home. His personal favorites are the "black and red 13's."

BIRDSEED

Full name is Jason Raynard Peters. His mother is Teledeo (pronounced Toledo) Simington and his stepfather is Ivory Simington. He has two sisters, Ivy and Chrissy.

Jason is quick to name his mother as the hero in his life, "My mom means everything to me. I definitely wouldn't be where I am today without her. She worked multiple jobs so she could provide for us. In the last year or so she lost over 100 pounds before undergoing two knee replacement surgeries. Now she's doing so much better. She continues to be such a big inspiration to me."

He is single and resides in South Jersey and in Atlanta, TX. He has a son, Jayshaun, who plays football, baseball, and basketball.

Majored in vocational education at Arkansas.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- With his 9th **Pro Bowl** selection and 7th as an Eagle in 2016, Peters has garnered the second-most Pro Bowl nods in team history behind **Chuck Bednarik** (eight)
- Earned *Associated Press* **All-Pro** honors following the 2007, '08, '10, '11, '13 and '14 campaigns. Was named to the first team in 2011 and 2013
- Joined **Frank "Bucko" Kilroy** (1953-55) as the only two offensive linemen in franchise history to earn a **Pro Bowl** berth in three consecutive years
- Since Peters' first **Pro Bowl** selection in 2007, only **Joe Thomas** (10) has been selected to as many Pro Bowls as an offensive lineman
- Has two career touchdowns: Blocked a punt and recovered it in the end zone (12/19/04 at Cin.) and caught **J.P. Losman's** first career TD pass (9/11/05 vs. Hou.)
- In 2014, was named a second-team *AP* **All-Pro** and garnered All-NFC honors from the Pro Football Writers of America
- Was part of an Eagles offensive line in 2013 that blocked for the NFL's leading rusher, **LeSean McCoy**, who finished with a franchise-best 1,607 rushing yards. Also helped the Eagles set a team record with 6,676 total yards and record the second-most points in franchise history (442)

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Left Arkansas after his junior season. Played in 36 games and caught 28 passes for 300 yards and 4 TDs as a tight end
- In 2003, earned All-SEC second team honors after starting every game at TE and ranking third on the team with 21 receptions for 218 yards and four TDs
- Played in 13 games (12 starts) as a tight end in 2002
- In 2001, played in 10 games (three starts). He began the season as a reserve defensive end and tackle, moving to tight end for the Auburn contest
- Redshirted in 2000, spending the season as a scout team defensive lineman
