Chance Warmack was signed by the Eagles during the 2017 offseason after spending the first four seasons of his career with the Titans. Warmack, who was selected by Tennessee with the 10th-overall pick in 2013, was a part of three national championship teams at Alabama, where he was tutored by Eagles OL coach Jeff Stoutland.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Saw action in 10 games in his first season with the Eagles, including 3 starts at left guard
- With starts in all 16 games at RG in 2013, became the first Titans rookie OL to start every game since **Michael Roos** in 2005
- Became the first OL selected by the Titans/Oilers in the 1st round (10th overall) since tackle **Brad Hopkins** (13th overall) in 1993 and the first guard drafted with the club's 1st-round choice since **Bruce Matthews** (9th overall) in 1983

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- In a four-year career at Alabama, appeared in 45 games, including starts in his final 40 contests at LG. Credited with 49 TD-resulting blocks while clearing lanes for individual ball carriers to record 25 performances of 100+ yards during his time in the starting lineup. Also totaled 316 key blocks/knockdowns for the Crimson Tide
- As a senior in 2012, was a first-team All-American selection while helping Alabama to a national championship, starting all 14 contests. Added All-SEC first-team accolades and was rated the best interior offensive lineman eligible for the 2013 NFL Draft by *The NFL Draft Report*

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Also in 2012, paced a veteran front wall with 37 pancakes, 128 key blocks/knockdowns and 19 TD-resulting blocks. Blocked for ten 100+ yard rushing performances, opening holes for a rushing offense that ranked 16th in the nation (227.5 yards per game), in addition to paving the way for the team's 445.5 yards per game in total offense
- As a junior in 2011, started all 13 games for the second consecutive season and was named honorable mention All-America by *Pro Football Weekly* and second-team All-SEC by the league's coaches. Helped Alabama rank 16th nationally in rushing offense (214.5 yards per game), while blocking for eleven 100+ yard rushers
- As a sophomore in 2010, took over the first-string LG duties, starting all 13 games. Helped the Crimson Tide rank 22nd nationally in total offense (444.1 yards per game). Anchored an offensive line that provided time for the nation's No. 4 quarterback in passing efficiency

BIRDSEED

At Alabama, Warmack developed the custom of rolling up his jersey to just under the numbers as a way to stay cooler. Soon, the look became known as "Warmacking," and fans began posting photos on social media of their exposed bellies. Warmack highlighted the best fan photos with what he called "Warmackin' Wednesdays."

Warmack's brother, Dallas, followed in his footsteps and played offensive line at Alabama before moving to Oregon as a graduate transfer in May 2018.

Warmack attended Westlake (GA) High School, where he played with Panthers QB **Cam Newton** during his freshman and sophomore years.
