



CARSON WALCH

WIDE RECEIVERS

4TH YEAR IN NFL • 2ND IN PHILADELPHIA

Carson Walch originally joined the Eagles coaching staff in 2018 as the team’s assistant wide receivers coach and was promoted to wide receivers coach during the 2019 offseason.

During his first season with the Eagles, Walch worked with a unit that featured veteran wide receivers Alshon Jeffery and Nelson Agholor. Under Walch’s direction, Jeffery recorded his highest receiving yardage (843) and reception totals (65) in a single season since 2014, despite missing the first three games of the regular season. Agholor recorded career highs in receptions (64) and yards after the catch (350). In 2018, Philadelphia registered the 7th-ranked passing offense (267.2) and 8th-ranked team passer rating (100.7) in the NFL. The Eagles also finished 9th in 10+ yard plays (235) and 10th in passing yards per play (6.7).

Prior to his return to the NFL, Walch spent two seasons with the Edmonton Eskimos (CFL) as offensive coordinator/receivers coach (2017) and receivers/passing game coordinator (2016). In 2015, Walch was an offensive consultant for the University of Minnesota.

From 2013-14, Walch served as an offensive quality control coach with the Chicago Bears, where he worked with Eagles offensive coordinator and former Bears wide receivers coach Mike Groh.

Walch also was a member of the Montreal Alouettes (CFL) coaching staff from 2010-12 (receivers coach, 2012; special teams assistant, 2010-11).

Before he began coaching professional football, Walch spent time at Winona State University (assistant head coach/offensive coordinator, 2007-09; wide receivers/passing game coordinator, 2000-02), University of St. Thomas (special teams coordinator/running backs coach, 2006) and Dakota State University (offensive coordinator, 2003-05).

Walch was an All-American, all-region and all-conference running back, receiver and return specialist for Winona State from 1996-99. In his final season, Walch was named a regional finalist for the Harlon Hill Award, which is earned by the top player in NCAA Division II football.

Walch has an undergraduate and master’s degree in education from Winona State.
