Roy Istvan was named the Eagles assistant offensive line coach during the 2019 offseason and joins the coaching staff from Keiser University, where he served as the Seahawks assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and offensive line coach during the school's inaugural football season in 2018. Prior to his year at Keiser, Istvan served as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at Cornell University for three seasons (2014-16).

From 2008-13, Istvan coached the offensive line at the University of Rhode Island and took on the added responsibility of offensive coordinator during his final three seasons (2011-13). He joined the Rhode Island coaching staff after a five-year stint with the University of Buffalo. During his first three years with the Bulls, Istvan worked as the team's run game coordinator/offensive line coach, prior to serving as offensive coordinator from 2004-05.

Istvan began his coaching career in 1990 as a graduate assistant at Southern Connecticut State University, where he worked alongside Eagles offensive line/run game coordinator Jeff Stoutland who served as the Owls offensive coordinator from 1988-92. Istvan played under Stoutland at SCSU and went on to coach at his alma mater for 11 years.

Istvan and his wife, Kristin, have three children: Jaylin and twins Kambria and Zachariah.
