G.J. Kinne joins the Eagles coaching staff after spending the 2018 season as an offensive analyst/quarterbacks coach at the University of Arkansas. Kinne began his coaching career in 2017 as a graduate assistant at SMU.

A former quarterback and wide receiver, Kinne spent time on the Philadelphia Eagles practice squad from 2013-15. He originally entered the NFL in 2012 as an undrafted free agent quarterback with the New York Jets and finished his NFL playing career as a member of the New York Giants practice squad in 2015. Following his time with the Giants, Kinne played quarterback for the Saskatchewan Roughriders in 2016.

Prior to signing with the Eagles during the 2013 offseason, Kinne played for the Omaha Nighthawks of the UFL and the San Antonio Talons of the Arena Football League.

Kinne played collegiately at Tulsa and finished his three-year career ranked second in school history in passing yards (9,472), total offense (10,831) and passing touchdowns (81). He was also a three-time team captain for the Golden Hurricane. As a senior, Kinne garnered second-team All-Conference USA honors after throwing for 3,090 yards and 28 touchdowns while also rushing for 405 yards and three touchdowns. As a junior in 2010, Kinne was named the Conference USA Offensive Player of the Year, as he completed 60 percent of his passes for 3,650 yards and 31 touchdowns, while also leading the team with 561 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. He became only the fifth Tulsa quarterback to pass for 30+ touchdowns in a season.

The Mesquite, TX, native began his college playing career at Texas in 2007, but transferred to Tulsa prior to the 2008 season. He graduated from Tulsa with a B.S. in exercise and sports science.
