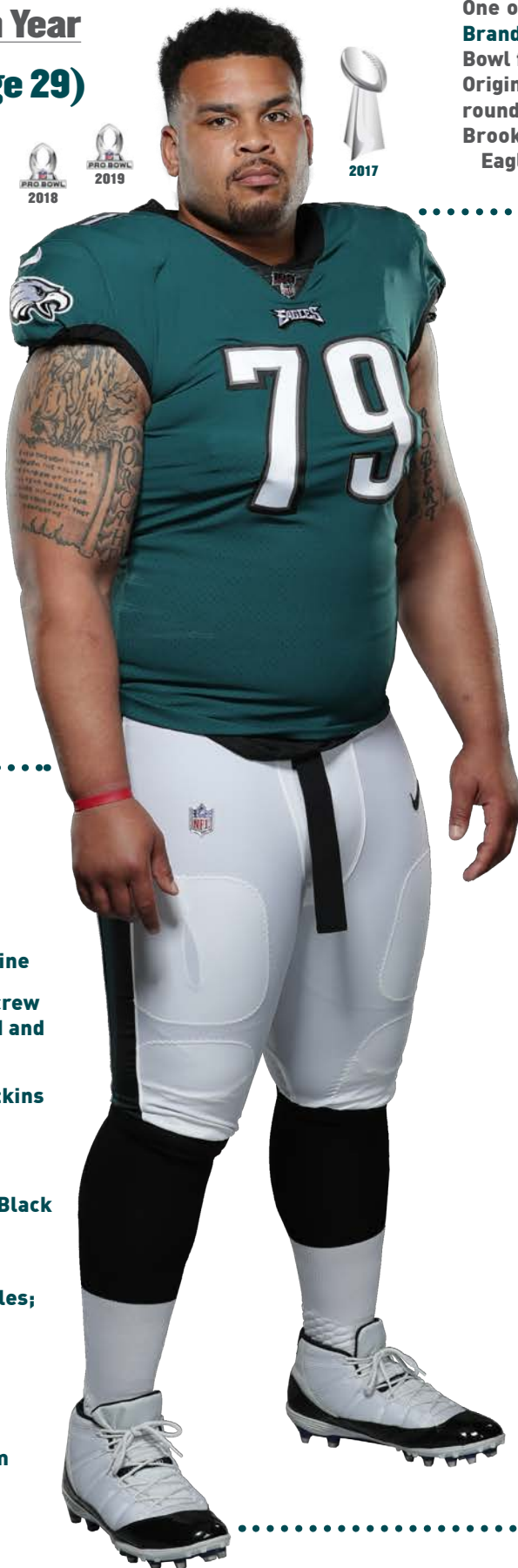

One of the top offensive guards in the NFL, **Brandon Brooks** has been voted to the Pro Bowl following each of the last two seasons. Originally selected by the Texans in the 3rd round (76th overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft, Brooks signed a 5-year contract with the Eagles during the 2016 offseason.

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Started all 16 regular-season games and both of the team's postseason contests in 2018. Earned **Pro Bowl** honors for the second-consecutive season
- Earned his first career **Pro Bowl** nod after playing an integral role on the Eagles' **Super Bowl LII**-winning offensive line. In 2017, helped the team rank 3rd in the NFL in offensive points (414, tied) and rushing offense (132.2) and 7th in total offense (365.8)
- Started 14 games at right guard in his first season with the Eagles in 2016
- In 2015, started 14 games for Houston, opening 13 contests at right guard and 1 at left guard. Also started the Texans' Wild Card game vs. KC (1/9/16)
- Opened 15 games for the Texans at right guard in 2014 and paved the way for the Texans ground game to accumulate 2,161 yards, the 2nd-most rushing yards in a single season in franchise history and the 5th-highest total in the NFL that season. Was part of an offensive line that surrendered just 26 sacks, marking the 4th-best total in the NFL
- Became a full-time starter in 2013 and opened 15 contests for the Texans at right guard

## COMMENCEMENT SPEECH

In May 2018, Brooks returned to his alma mater at Miami (Ohio) to deliver a commencement speech to a graduating class of more than 4,000 students. His inspirational speech highlighted his battle with anxiety and also touched on the importance of having a positive outlook on life.

“I am proud of a number of accomplishments I achieved this year - Pro Bowl, Super Bowl - but I am especially proud of defeating the anxiety that has affected me in the past. Truth be told - today I’m feeling a little anxious, but I’ve learned through therapy to not worry or care about making a mistake. Why? Because the best thing about life is that it goes on.”

## AN EARLY INFLUENCE

Brooks cites his former neighbor, Jarrod Johnson, as the biggest influence on his football career. Johnson, a former offensive lineman, played with the San Diego Chargers, the Pittsburgh Steelers and the Sacramento Surge of the World League. The two still talk to this day.

## COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Registered 287 knockdowns and 47 touchdown-resulting blocks, including 35 touchdown-resulting blocks on the RedHawks' 40 rushing touchdowns during his career
- Made the switch to right guard for his senior season (2011) and started all 12 games, earning an appearance in the East-West Shrine Game
- Missed the beginning of his junior season (2010) with an injury, but returned to start two games at left tackle and four games at left guard, helping the RedHawks go 6-0 in those contests. Despite the injury, earned All-MAC second-team honors for a second-consecutive season
- As a sophomore in 2009, earned second-team All-MAC honors after starting 12 games at left tackle and registering 12 touchdown-resulting blocks
- Was named the RedHawks Freshman of the Year as a redshirt freshman in 2008 after he started all 12 games at left guard and recorded 70 knockdowns
