Originally selected by Philadelphia in the 3rd round (79th overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft, **Isaac Seumalo** (pronounced SAY-u-MAH-low) signed a three-year extension during the 2019 offseason. A versatile offensive lineman out of Oregon State, Seumalo has made starts at three different spots (LG, RG and RT) during his first three NFL seasons and started a career-high 9 games (all at LG) in 2018.

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Made a career-high 9 starts (all at LG) in 2018 and also started both of the team's playoff contests
- Proved to be a key reserve on the offensive line as a rookie in 2016, seeing action in 9 games and starting 4 contests at three different positions (2 at RG, 1 at LG, 1 at RT)
- Made the first start of his career when he opened at RG vs. GB (11/28/16)

## COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Made 37 career starts at Oregon State, opening contests at every position on the offensive line except for left guard
- Sat out the 2014 season recovering from a foot injury, but returned to the field as a redshirt junior in 2015 and went on to start all 12 games for the Beavers (9 at RG, 3 at LT). Prior to the season, was named to the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award watch lists and finished the year with All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention and Pac-12 All-Academic First Team honors

## BIRDSEED

Seumalo is the son of Karen and Joe Seumalo and has three brothers (Andrew, Levi and Noah) and one sister (Jessi).

Seumalo prepped at Corvallis (OR) High School, where he was named 5A First-Team All-State as an offensive and defensive lineman in both his junior and senior seasons. He was also an Under Armour and ESPN All-American.

- Started 10 games at center and 2 games at RT as a sophomore in 2013, earning Pac-12 All-Conference Second Team honors. Also named to the Capital One Academic All-District team and the Pac-12 All-Academic First Team
- In 2012, became the first freshman starting center for Oregon State since **Roger Levasa** in 1978. Was just one of two true freshmen in the country to start their team's season opener at center. Earned All-Pac-12 honorable mention and was named Freshman All-America by *Phil Steele* and *CBSSports.com*
