One of the most productive running backs in Penn State history, **Miles Sanders** was selected by the Eagles in the 2nd round (53rd overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft. Sanders earned All-Big Ten honors as a junior in 2018, when he ranked 2nd in the conference with a career-high 1,274 rushing yards (marked the 5th-most rushing yards by a Nittany Lion since 2000).

BIRDSEED

Sanders attended Woodland Hills (PA) HS, where he was tabbed as PIAA Class AAA All-State first team in 2014 and 2015. He helped lead the school to 39 victories during his career, finishing with 4,573 yards on 508 carries and 59 touchdowns, landing him fifth in WPIAL Class AAAA history.

Sanders also ran track for Woodland Hills, competing in the 100, 200 and 4x100.

Miles is the son of Marlene Sanders and has one older brother, Brian, and a younger brother, Kobe. His hobbies include playing video games, training and watching Netflix.

NOTES TO KNOW

- Sanders is the first NFL RB to record at least 850 scrimmage yards and 300 return yards in his first 12 career games since **Adrian Peterson** in 2007
- Through 12 games, ranks 5th in all-purpose yards (1,190) in Eagles rookie history. Also ranks 3rd in scrimmage yards (879) in rookie franchise history
- Totaled 47 scrimmage yards vs. NE (11/17/19) becoming the third player in team history to post 1,000+ all-purpose yards in their first 10 career games, joining **DeSean Jackson** in 2008 (1,085) and **Ted Dean** in 1960 (1,066)

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

2019 - PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (12/7)

- Rushed for a career-high 83 yards at Mia. (12/1/19) while adding 22 yards on a career-high 5 receptions, including a 15-yard TD on the Eagles' first possession. Finished the game with 105 scrimmage yards, which marked his 3rd career game with 100+ yards on offense (also 126 on 9/22/19 vs. Detroit; 118 on 10/27/19 at Buffalo)

As a junior in 2018, Sanders ranked 2nd in the Big Ten Conference with a career-high 1,274 rushing yards, which are the 5th-most by a Penn State RB since 2000.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Combined for 118 scrimmage yards (74 rushing, 44 receiving) and 1 rushing TD in the win at Buf. (10/27/19). Sanders and **Jordan Howard** became the first Eagles RB duo to each rush for 70+ yards and 1+ TD in a road game since **Leroy Keyes** and **Tom Woodeshick** on 11/9/69 at Washington. The Eagles' 218 rushing yards marked their highest single-game total during the **Doug Pederson** era (since 2016).
- Recorded a career-long 65-yard rushing TD on the opening drive of the third quarter in the win against the Bills. Marked the longest rushing TD by an Eagles rookie since Bryce Brown on 12/26/12 vs. Carolina (also 65 yards) and is tied for the 7th-longest in team rookie history
- Led the Eagles with a career-high 86 receiving yards, including a 32-yard TD reception, at Min. (10/13/19). The TD marked his first score as a pro. Led the Eagles with a career-high 86 receiving yards, including a 32-yard TD reception, at Min. (10/13/19). Registered a 30+ yard play from scrimmage in 4 consecutive games, totaling six 30+ yard plays (5 receiving, 1 rushing) in that span. His five 30+ yard receptions were the most by an NFL rookie RB through 6 games since at least 1991





SEASON HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Combined for 88 all-purpose yards, including 49 yards on 4 receptions, in the win vs. NYJ (10/6/19). Registered a 36-yard catch in the first quarter.
- Rushed for a career-high 72 yards (6.5 avg.) in the win at GB (9/26/19), including a career-long 30-yard run on the first play from scrimmage of the Eagles' game-winning TD drive. Marked the longest rush by an Eagles rookie since **Bryce Brown** on 12/2/12 at Dallas (39 yards).
- Also posted a career-long 67-yard kickoff return to set up the Eagles' first TD drive at GB (9/26/19). It was the longest kickoff return by an Eagles rookie since **Wendell Smallwood's** 86-yard return TD on 10/16/16 at Washington and the longest by any Eagle since **Josh Huff's** 98-yard kickoff return TD on 10/23/16 vs. Minnesota
- Led the team with 126 scrimmage yards (53 rushing, 73 receiving) vs. Det. (9/22/19). Became the first Eagle to lead the team in both rushing yards and receiving yards in the same game since **LeSean McCoy** on 12/30/12 at NYG. Additionally, became the first NFL rookie RB (and only such Eagle since 2000) to record multiple 30+ yard receptions in a single game since **D'Onta Foreman** (Hou.) on 9/24/17 at New England. His 40-yard catch was the longest by an Eagles rookie RB since **LeSean McCoy** on 11/8/09 vs. Dallas (45 yards)
- Made first NFL start at Atl. (9/15/19)

- Posted a 19-yard run that moved the Eagles offense to the WAS 3 during a third-quarter TD drive in the win vs. Was. (9/8/19). Marked the longest rushing play by an Eagles rookie in a season opener since **Vaughn Hebron** on 9/5/93 vs. Phoenix (33 yards)

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Rushed 276 times for 1,649 yards (6.0 avg.) and 12 TDs in 38 career games at Penn State. Also added 32 catches for 193 yards and 1 TD
- Finished his career as the 45th player in program history to rush for more than 1,000 yards and 25th all-time with 1,649 rushing yards
- As a junior in 2018, ranked 2nd in the Big Ten Conference with a career-high 1,274 rushing yards, which are the 5th-most by a Penn State RB since 2000 (11th overall). Rushed for 9 TDs and posted 24 receptions for 139 yards
- Appeared in 12 games (1 start) as a sophomore in 2017, making his first career start vs. Rutgers (11/11/17)
- Made his collegiate debut as a freshman in 2016 vs. Kent State (9/3/16). Posted a school season record for kickoff returns (33)
