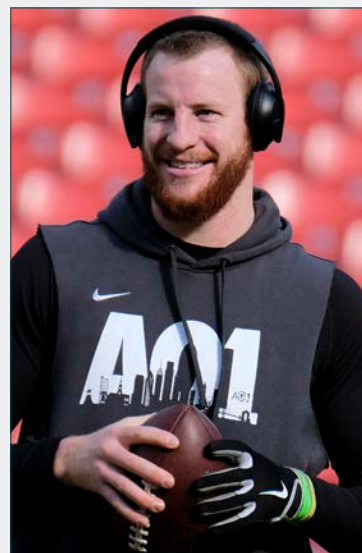


## CARSON WENTZ AO1 FOUNDATION

During the 2017 offseason, Wentz launched the **Carson Wentz Audience of One Foundation**, which is a nonprofit whose mission is to “uplift individuals and communities around the world by demonstrating God’s love for His people.” The foundation’s signature event, an annual charity softball game with Eagles players at the home of the Philadelphia Phillies, Citizens Bank Park, has drawn more than 40,000 fans and raised over \$1.3 million for charitable initiatives over the last two years.

A major focus of the foundation is its partnership with Mission of Hope in funding and constructing the Haiti Sports Complex, a multi-purpose sports facility and education center on Mission of Hope’s campus. Over 15,000 children per year will have access to education tutoring, will be provided meals and vitamins to support nutrition, and have a safe place with power and internet to study. The Audience of One Foundation has invested nearly \$1 million in funds for the Haiti Sports Complex.

The foundation’s food truck program, Thy Kingdom Crumb, was launched in 2018 and has freely distributed quality food to communities in need throughout the Philadelphia area. Another example of Wentz’s community outreach is an outdoor program, Camp Conquerors, which serves those with physical challenges, life-threatening illnesses and the underserved by providing various hunting and fishing opportunities.



## THE DUTCH DESTROYER

In May 2017, Wentz befriended a boy named Lukas Kusters, who earned the nickname **“Dutch Destroyer”** for his fearless spirit on the football field. Lukas, who was diagnosed with a tumor in his abdomen when he was 8 years old, had received an inspirational video message from Wentz and his only wish was to thank his favorite player for the gesture.

The Eagles invited Lukas’ family to the NovaCare Complex and what was supposed to be a short visit turned into hours. As part of his thank you, Lukas gave Wentz a wristband that says, “Dutch Destroyer,” and Wentz has worn it every day since.



Less than two weeks after his visit, Lukas passed away at 10 years old and was buried in Wentz’s jersey. Wentz wears his “Dutch Destroyer” wristband every game because Lukas’ dream was to play for the Eagles, and with Wentz he can be on an NFL field every Sunday.

Wentz, who regularly keeps in touch with Lukas’ family, helped share Lukas’ story with ESPN’s Tom Rinaldi, and weeks after the interview aired, the family raised nearly \$200,000 through wristband purchases that went towards charities that aid families fighting childhood cancer.

“It’s so much deeper than football is what it comes down to. It’s more than just a game.”



## MISSION OF HOPE

During the offseason, Wentz travels to Port-au-Prince, Haiti, with **Mission of Hope**, a Christian organization that seeks transformative change for the people of Haiti. During each mission trip, Wentz embraces the culture while sharing his faith, playing with kids and helping paint homes in the community.

“It was very eye-opening to see how much need there really is, and how they’re lacking so many things materialistically. But emotionally and mentally, it was one of the most joyful communities. I think the biggest thing I learned about myself was life isn’t all about stuff. Going there and seeing it gave me an entirely different perspective.”

## BIRDSEED

Wentz was originally born in Raleigh, NC, and moved to Bismarck, ND, when he was 4 years old. Wentz attended Bismarck Century (ND) High School, where he was named the 2010 North Dakota Class 3A Player of the Year and earned all-state and all-conference honors. He was a three-year starter on Bismarck Century’s baseball team and also played forward/center on the school’s basketball team.

Wentz majored in health and physical education with a minor in psychology at North Dakota State.

Wentz and his wife, Madison, married during the 2018 offseason. The couple has three golden retrievers – Henley, Jersey and Riggs – and they are expecting the birth of their first child – a daughter – this spring.

## CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- In 2019, led the Eagles to a postseason berth and NFC East division title after producing single-season franchise records in completions (388) and passing yards (4,039)
- Registered the highest completion percentage (69.6%) in Eagles single-season history in 2018 (min. 250 attempts)
- Named second-team **All-Pro** by the *Associated Press* and earned his first career **Pro Bowl** nod following the 2017 season. Finished 3rd in MVP voting, behind **Tom Brady** and **Todd Gurley**
- Led the **Super Bowl LII**-winning Eagles to an 11-2 record in games that he started in 2017. Established a single-season team record with 33 passing TDs, breaking the previous mark of 32 set by Pro Football Hall of Famer **Sonny Jurgensen** in 1961
- Owns the NFL rookie record for completions (379 in 2016)

## NOTES TO KNOW

- Is one of just six QBs in NFL history to record three consecutive seasons with 20+ passing TDs and 10-or-fewer INTs, joining **Tom Brady** (2014-17), **Drew Brees** (2017-19), **Peyton Manning** (2003-06), **Aaron Rodgers** (2014-16) and **Russell Wilson** (2012-15)
- Has produced the 3rd-most passing TDs per game (2.0) in the NFL since 2017, trailing only **Patrick Mahomes** (2.5) and **Russell Wilson** (2.1) in that category (min. 30 games)
- Owns the 6th-highest passer rating (98.3) in the NFL since 2017, behind **Drew Brees** (111.3), **Patrick Mahomes** (108.9), **Russell Wilson** (103.6), **Deshaun Watson** (101.0) and **Kirk Cousins** (99.9) (min. 1,000 attempts). His 103.8 rating on third and fourth down trails only Mahomes (118.8) (min. 200 attempts), while his 107.8 red zone rating trails only Brees (113.3) (min. 100 attempts)

## SEASON HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Only three NFL QBs posted 20+ offensive TDs with 0 giveaways in the red zone: **Josh Allen** (12 pass, 9 rush), **Lamar Jackson** (24 pass, 5 rush) and Wentz (19 pass, 1 rush)
- Totaled 3 game-winning drives, including 2 fourth quarter/OT comebacks, during the Eagles' division-clinching, 4-game winning streak from Weeks 14-17. Completed 117-of-173 (67.6%) attempts for 1,199 yards (299.8 ypg), 7 TDs, 0 INTs and a 100.8 passer rating, including 439 yards, 4 TDs and a 127.0 rating on 37-of-50 (74.0%) passing in the fourth quarter/OT
- Became the first QB in NFL history to record 30+ completions with 0 INTs in 3 consecutive games (12/9/19-12/22/19)

### 2018 - PHILADELPHIA (11/11, 0/0)

- Registered the highest completion percentage (69.6%) in Eagles single-season history, which ranked 3rd in the NFL, behind **Drew Brees** (74.4%) and **Kirk Cousins** (70.1%) (min. 250 attempts). Also ranked 7th with a career-high 102.2 passer rating
- Became the second QB in NFL history to record 30+ attempts and a 115.0+ passer rating in 4 consecutive games (11/7/18-10/28/18). The only other QBs to do so are **Drew Brees** (12/8/19-12/29/19) and **Peyton Manning** (9/30/12-10/28/12)
- Posted a career-best 180 consecutive attempts without an INT from 9/23/18-10/28/18, which is the longest streak by an Eagle since **Nick Foles** from 12/23/12-12/8/13 (237 attempts)

### 2017 - PHILADELPHIA (13/13, 0/0)

- Named second-team **All-Pro** by the *Associated Press* and earned his first career **Pro Bowl** nod after leading the **Super Bowl LII**-winning Eagles to an 11-2 record in games that he started. Finished 3rd in MVP voting, behind **Tom Brady** and **Todd Gurley**

## SEASON HIGHLIGHTS (Continued)

- Established a single-season team record with 33 passing TDs, breaking the previous mark of 32 set by Pro Football Hall of Famer **Sonny Jurgensen** in 1961. Ranked 2nd in the NFL in passing TDs, trailing only **Russell Wilson** (34), while leading the league in both passing TDs per game (2.5) and passing TD percentage (7.5%)
- Is one of only three NFL QBs to throw 33+ TDs and no more than 7 INTs through 13 games, joining **Tom Brady** in 2015 (33-6) and 2007 (45-5) and **Aaron Rodgers** in 2014 (35-3) and 2011 (39-6)
- Ranked 4th in the NFL with a 101.9 passer rating, behind **Alex Smith** (104.7), **Drew Brees** (103.9) and **Tom Brady** (102.8). Owned the best third-down rating (123.7) and red zone rating (116.0)
- Posted a career-high-tying 4 TDs in the 43-35, division-clinching win at LAR (12/10/17). Connected with **Alshon Jeffery** on a 2-yard TD on fourth down to give the Eagles a 31-28 advantage in the third quarter. The score marked Wentz's franchise-record-breaking 33rd passing TD of the season
- Selected as **NFC Offensive Player of the Month** after throwing for 1,247 yards, 14 TDs, 3 INTs and a 110.4 passer rating while leading the Eagles to a 5-0 record in October. Became the first Eagle to win the award since **LeSean McCoy** in December 2013
- Named **NFC Offensive Player of the Week** after throwing a career-high-tying 4 TDs, registering a 126.3 rating and rushing for a career-high 63 yards in the 34-24 win vs. Was. (10/23/17)

## 2016 - PHILADELPHIA (16/16)

- Set an NFL rookie record for completions (379) while also producing the 4th-most passing yards (3,782) in NFL rookie history, trailing only **Andrew Luck** in 2012 (4,374), **Cam Newton** in 2011 (4,051) and **Jameis Winston** in 2015 (4,042)
