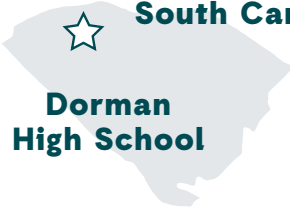

J.J. Arcega-Whiteside (pronounced are-THAY-guh) was originally selected by the Eagles in the 2nd round (57th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft. He played collegiately at Stanford, where he produced the 2nd-most receiving TDs (28) in school history and earned All-Pac-12 honors after leading the conference in receiving TDs (14) and ranking 3rd in receiving yards (1,059) as a junior in 2018.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS

2019 - PHILADELPHIA (16/5, 1/0)

- Finished his rookie season with 10 receptions for 169 yards (16.9 avg.) and 1 TD, including 4 catches for 20+ yards
- Caught his first career TD on a 15-yard pass from **Carson Wentz** that gave the Eagles a 21-14 lead with 6 seconds remaining in the first half at Mia. (12/1/19)

COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

- Totaled 135 receptions for 2,219 yards (16.4 avg.) and 28 TDs in 33 career games. Finished with the 2nd-most receiving TDs in school history, behind **Ken Margerum** (30, 1977-80)
- Garnered All-Pac-12 honors after tying for the 3rd-most receiving TDs (14) among NCAA FBS players and producing the 3rd-most receiving yards (1,059) in the conference as a junior. Led his team with a career-high 63 receptions

Arcega-Whiteside majored in international relations while at Stanford and interned at the office of Condoleezza Rice. He delivered mail, screened calls and responded to emails on behalf of Rice throughout his internship.

Arcega-Whiteside was born in Zaragoza, Spain, and moved to South Carolina at age 6. He learned English as a third language and has lived in several countries, including the United States, Spain, Portugal and Italy. He is the son of Joaquin Arcega and Valorie Whiteside, who both played basketball professionally overseas.

Arcega-Whiteside prepped at Dorman (SC) High School, where he was the school's career leader in receptions (207), receiving yards (3,779) and TDs (38), while averaging 18.2 yards per catch as a three-year varsity starter. He also lettered in basketball and track and field.
